The Presidents Are Coming!

The United States is honoring our Nation's Presidents by issuing a series of \$1 circulating coins featuring their images. This exhibit highlights the new coins and the history behind presidential images on U.S. money. Each Presidential dollar is described, along with highlights of the career of the president depicted.

Four Presidential \$1 coins will be issued per year, each with a reverse design featuring the Statue of Liberty. These coins feature artwork specifically designed to be larger and more dramatic than on previous dollars, and will include, for the first time since the early 1930s, inscriptions on the edge of the coins. Using the "third side" for the required mint, year of issue and mottos "E Pluribus Unum" and "In God We Trust" provides more room for the larger artwork on obverse and reverse.

In conjunction with the Presidential coin series, the Mint is also producing commemorative half-ounce \$10 gold coins celebrating the wives of the presidents. This "First Spouse" coinage features a portrait of the spouse on the obverse and an image related to their life or accomplishments on the reverse. Alternative designs will be produced to cover those Presidents who served without a spouse. These coins will also be offered as a series of bronze medals.
