MONEY OF THE OLYMPIADS



The ancient Olympic Games started in 776 B.C. as part of religious festivals to honor the gods. The history of the Games was preserved in part by coins that were struck both to enhance the prestige of the Olympics and to serve as legal tender at the Games.

Like modern Olympiads, the ancient Games encouraged fierce competition, personal excellence and endurance while promoting understanding and friendship among nations. Unlike today's Games, however, an international truce was announced, wars were suspended, legal disputes were forbidden and armies were barred from the area.

Some Olympic traditions have survived nearly three millennia. For example, Graeco-Roman wrestling is depicted on coinage dating back to the 7th century B.C.
