2019 ADULT (AGE 18+) SCHOLARSHIP APPLICATION INFORMATION FOR THE APPLICANT

TYPES OF SCHOLARSHIPS AWARDED:

Full: Full scholarships cover tuition, lodging, and meals for one week, and up to \$550 in travel reimbursement.

Partial: Partial scholarships cover tuition only.

ELIGIBILITY:

The applicant must be an ANA member (age 18 or over). Applications may be typed, but the applicant must personally complete the application and one page essay. Incomplete applications will not be considered.

SELECTION PROCESS:

Scholarships are awarded on the basis of merit. In addition, a number of scholarships will be awarded on the basis of merit and financial need combined. Refer to the "Financial Aid" section below for more information. Each application is thoroughly reviewed by a selection committee and scored according to the following 100 point system:

Maximum Points	Categories
60	Involvement, Leadership and Accomplishments
30	Essay and written parts of application
10	Overall impression of Selection Committee

The selection committee's decision is final. Applications will remain confidential.

TIPS FOR ALL APPLICANTS:

Pay attention to detail and follow the instructions. Your application should be concise and direct, reveal interesting things about yourself, and describe how your strengths, achievements, and passions make you a strong candidate for a scholarship. In other words, impress us. The selection committee reviews dozens of applications. They will look upon your application favorably if your essays are free of typos and grammatical errors, and if you include <u>all</u> and <u>only</u> the materials requested. If you have questions or concerns, please contact us.

FINANCIAL AID:

A number of scholarships will be awarded on the basis of merit and financial need combined. Members with financial need should also complete Section 10 of the scholarship application.

PREVIOUS SCHOLARSHIP RECIPIENTS:

For returning scholarship recipients, the selection committee will be placing more emphasis on how the applicants used their previous Summer Seminar education to further their numismatic involvement and accomplishments.

APPLICATION DEADLINE: Applications and registration form <u>must</u> be postmarked on or before February 1, 2019. No exceptions will be made.

- Numismatic research you are currently working on or have completed.
- Numismatic education you are currently working on or have completed. Example: ANA correspondence courses, ANA seminars, etc.
- Numismatic programs or events you have helped to organize. Examples: coin show, youth program, auction, etc.
- If you are currently (or were previously) employed in the field of numismatics, please provide the name of your employer, length of employment and describe your work responsibilities.
- List any other numismatic involvement, leadership or accomplishments we should know about.
