

Winter Education Committee Report 2017 - 2018

The Education Committee has met regularly and has worked on many projects to completion as well as ongoing issues. The following are highlights of the committee's work:

- Women in Numismatics Membership – The Education Committee has worked out an agreement with Women in Numismatics (WIN). YN's who are members of the ANA can apply for a free one year membership to WIN. The same agreement exists with the Combined Organization of Numismatic Error Collectors of America (CONECA).
- Coins for A's - One of the most successful programs instituted by the Education Committee is Coins for A's. As of this report, there are more than 1,600 students who are active in this program.
- World War I Centennial Dollar - The committee is happy to report that as of January 17, 2018, the United States Mint has made the World War I Centennial Commemorative Dollar available to the public. The commemorative coin was the brainchild of the ANA.
- Coins in the Classroom - Funding has begun for Coins in the Classroom. Plans for a new venue will be revealed soon.
- Scouting – The Education Committee continues to work with counselors who are holding classes for Merit badge workshops and Fun With Money Patches. Both Scout classes will be available at the World's Fair of Money in Philadelphia.
- Educated Grading Set - The Education Grading Set is almost completed. The only type that is not finished are Standing Liberty Quarters.
- E-Learning – The committee has reviewed and submitted their recommendations for e-learning platforms.
