ANA looks to begin building next generation site

Money.org, the American Numismatic Association's primary website, was successfully relaunched on Tuesday afternoon, July 24, with a new content-management system in place that is designed to make the website more stable, eliminate log-in errors and improve the end-user's experience in the members-only section.

"We experienced a few small bugs right after we launched, and we'll continue to work those out over the next couple of days," said ANA Executive Director Jeff Shevlin. "But overall, we feel like our members are getting a much better website that will have fewer problems and much more stability. Now, we'll turn our attention to building a brand-new Money.org."
