## **Make Plans Today to Attend the Orlando National Money Show®**

*Convention Offers Opportunities for Collectors and Investors*

Visit the American Numismatic Association's (ANA) National Money Show in Orlando for the best selection of collectibles in the United States. The three-day convention takes place March 9-11 in West Hall E of the Orange County Convention Center at 9400 Universal Blvd. Tangible assets such as rare coins, gold and silver, are in great demand, and the show features more than 350 numismatic dealers with extensive inventories.

The 2017 National Money Show features a wide range of technical seminars and educational presentations; collector exhibits; a major auction by Kagin's, Inc.; activities for children; and the ANA Museum Showcase, exhibiting some of the world's most valuable and beautiful coins and paper money.

Show hours are 10 a.m. to 6:00 p.m. on Thursday and Friday, March 9 and 10; and 10 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. on Saturday, March 11. Last admission is 30 minutes prior to closing. General admission is \$8. Admission is free on Saturday, March 11. Admission is always free for ANA members and children 12 and under.
