These are just a few of the things families can see and do at the American Numismatic Association World's Fair of Money®.



Real \$100,000 Bills: The United States Treasury Department Bureau of Engraving and Printing exhibits its eye-opening "Billion Dollar Showcase" that includes colorful \$100,000 currency notes, the highest denomination paper money ever produced by the U.S. Contact: Kevin Brown Where: Booth #690



United States Mint: Representatives of the United States Mint will be displaying and selling examples of their latest gold and silver coins specially struck for collectors including America the Beautiful[™] guarterdollars honoring state parks and national sites, Presidential dollars and precious metal bullion coins. Historic \$8 Million Gold Coins Collection: A 46-coin set of the first U.S. "Double Eagles" (\$20 denomination) gold coins on display in public for the first time. Many of the coins were made from California Gold Rush ore and some were recovered from famous shipwrecks. World Famous, Multi-Million Dollar Nickel: From the American Numismatic Association Money Museum in Colorado Springs, Colorado, see one of the five known 1913 Liberty Head nickels, insured for \$3 million. One owner of this famous coin notoriously carried it in his pockets for years to frequently show to strangers. **Contact: Doug Mudd at the Museum Showcase, Booth #1000**

Gold Rush Sunken Treasure: This huge California Gold Rush ingot weighs 754 ounces (a quarter-dollar is next to it for size comparison). It was recovered from the 1857 wreck of the "Ship of Gold," the *SS Central America*, and will be displayed courtesy of Brian Hendelson and Classic Coin Co. **Where: Museum Showcase, Booth #1000**



First Time In USA: A display from Banco de Mexico previously not seen in the United States of some of the 60,000 Mexican bank notes seized by the United States from Victoriano Huerta's forces during the 1914 occupation of Veracruz, and subsequently returned to Mexico. The stash includes rare and previously unknown Mexican notes. **Where: Museum Showcase, Booth #1000**



<u>Masterpieces of Ancient Numismatics</u>: Visitors to the World's Fair of Money can see examples of the superb craftsmanship of ancient Greece with the display of four Dekadrachms (large silver coins) of Syracuse designed by two of the most famous coin engravers of the ancient world, Kimon and Euainetos. These showpieces are considered to be among the most beautiful coins ever produced. **Where: Museum Showcase, Booth #1000**
