Auctions to Feature Spectacular Offerings

Heritage Auctions and Stack's Bowers Galleries—official auctioneers for the 2018 World's Fair of Money–are featuring some ultra rare currency at the show.



Stack's Bowers is offering an 1860 Commercial Bank of Canada 1 Dollar note in a PMG Choice Fine 15 holder, hand signed by J. Davidson. Obverse: William Penn; English real estate entrepreneur, philosopher, early Quaker, and founder of the British North American colony the Province of Pennsylvania.

Reverse: Robert Indiana's famous LOVE sculpture, located in JFK Plaza near Philadelphia's City Hall.
