The 2018 World's Fair of Money® in Philadelphia, PA. is fast approaching, and so are many of the registration deadlines for the Aug. 14-18 show, which will be held in Hall D and E of the Pennsylvania Convention Center, located at 1101 Arch St.

Show hours are 1 p.m. to 6 p.m. Aug. 14; 10 a.m. to 6 p.m. Aug. 15-17; and 10 a.m. to 4 p.m. Aug. 18. ANA members can enter the show 30 minutes before the public. Admission is \$8 for adults; ANA members and children 12 and under are always free. Last admission is 30 minutes prior to closing.

Register online by July 3 for event and seminar discounts.



Coin Grading, Problem Coins & Conservation

(Prior to the Philadelphia World's Fair of Money)

The biggest mistake collectors and dealers make is buying coins they shouldn't have purchased in the first place—coins that have grade, surface or conservation issues that they didn't see.

This seminar will help students avoid costly mistakes by developing their grading skills and teaching them to spot a wide variety of surface

problems, enhancements, alterations and conservation issues that can adversely affect a coin's grade. The material covered is comprehensive and suitable for novice and experienced collectors. The seminar uses images, discussion and hands-on examination of hundreds of coins in the ANA's Grading Sets.

An Introduction to Collecting Ancient Greek & Roman Coins

Students will learn the basics of collecting ancient Greek and Roman coins in this two-day class, designed specifically for new and beginning collectors.
