Note: The \$25 increase will help reduce the yearly ANA subsidy banquet cost, which is currently about \$55 to \$60 per person. By doing so, the ANA will lower its overall banquet costs, in line with our strategy to reduce costs and better balance our budget. On the other hand, an increase in ticket rates might have an adverse impact by reducing the number of exhibitors and/or others who would attend the banquet. This would have financial implications for the ANA if we fail to meet our set banquet attendance goal/guarantee.

Note: This policy could be a lasting solution, as we would only deal with this issue once. It would offer an alternative to doubling the banquet cost as well as help reduce the annual ANA subsidy cost. If the banquet ticket price were \$80, then the discounted rate would be \$40 per person. If it were \$75, then the discounted rate would be \$37.50, etc. This would reduce the ANA's 2014 banquet subsidy by approximately \$5,500+.

Another consideration is that our Rosemont Hyatt Hotel banquet contract does not have a specified minimum attendance requirement. Our ANA hotel contracts through 2016 require us to hold a banquet and/or meet an agreed upon concession (meal and beverage requirements); otherwise, we pay a penalty and/or face increased room rates. After 2016, we can examine the possibility of not holding a banquet at ANA WFM conventions in non-election years. Additionally, we can look into the concept of presenting all our Association awards during the Member Awards Reception instead of at a banquet.

7) MEDIATION POLICY REVISION

MOTION by Vice President Garrett, second by______, to adopt the changes of the Mediation Policy as proposed and to incorporate these changes into the ANA Policy Manual.

Complaints and Mediation Services

ANA members must adhere to the ANA Code of Ethics. Any member who is determined, after having had an opportunity to respond to a complaint, to have violated the ANA Code of Ethics as contained in the Bylaws, is subject to disciplinary action by the ANA.

Informal Stage of Mediation: STRIKE

Upon receipt of a written Complaint, the Mediation Department will advise the person about whom the complaint has been made and attempt to facilitate a resolution between the Complainant and the member Respondent to arrive at a mutually acceptable solution. No formal response is required at this stage of the mediation process. Most complaints are resolved in this manner.

Rationale: Should the respondent be responsible, this process allows more delay in satisfying the complaint. It should be stated a **complaint** with action taking place upon completion of the mediation form and fee paid. On average, half of the complaints include months or even years of negotiation between parties prior to the Association being notified.

Formal Mediation Proceedings: MODIFY

If the informal efforts fail to resolve the complaint, the complaint will be reviewed by the Executive Director and the General Counsel to determine whether the complaint meets the minimum criteria necessary to be considered by the Mediation Committee. For all such Complaints that meet the necessary criteria to proceed to the formal mediation process, the following Association guidelines will apply. The Respondent will be notified of the complaint and a written response will be required within 30 days of notification of complaint. The Complainant will be notified of the Respondents reply and may respond, if desired, to the Association within 15 days of notification. The formal complaint and both parties documentation will be referred to the Mediation Committee. If disciplinary action is taken against an ANA member, the name, city and state of the member in question, along with the grounds for disciplinary action, are published in *The Numismatist*.

Rationale: This paragraph needs to be simplified as follows:

For all such Complaints that meet the necessary criteria, the following Association guidelines will apply. The Respondent will be notified of the complaint and a written response will be required within 30 days of notification of complaint. The Complainant will be notified of the Respondent's reply and may respond, if desired, to the Association within 15 days of notification. The formal

complaint and both parties' documentation will be referred to the Mediation Committee. If disciplinary action is taken against an ANA member, the name, city and state of the member in question, along with the grounds for disciplinary action, may be published in The Numismatist per ANA board approval.

Mediation Fees - ANA Members: ELIMINATE PERCENTAGE & INCREASE MEDIATION FEES

For current Association members who were members at the time of the actions complained of, the "Member Fees" rate shall be paid to the Association. For non-ANA members or for matters where the Complainant was not an ANA member at the time of the actions complained of, the "Non-Member Fees" rate shall be paid to the Association.

Value at:	Member Fees	Non-Member Fees
\$0-1000.00	\$100.00	\$200.00
\$1000.01 +	\$150.00	\$300.00

For matters not involving a numismatic transaction or where no monetary value is involved, the minimum processing fee is \$200.00 for ANA Members and \$400.00 for Non-ANA Members: *STRIKE*

Rationale: If the transaction were \$0, then the fee would be applicable as addressed above.

It is the policy of the Association to defer offering mediation services to individual members regarding payment disputes until 90 days and all other efforts to resolve are extinguished.

The Association will not intercede with disputes involving auction or grading companies.
