ANA Invites Exhibitors to Charlotte National Money Show™ March 16-18

The American Numismatic Association is inviting all members to showcase their collections, expertise and imagination with fellow hobbyists by presenting a numismatic exhibit at the Charlotte National Money Show™.

The collector exhibit area brings together talented numismatists and unique collections from across the country, and is a highlight of every ANA convention. All areas of numismatics are represented, including United States coins and paper money, ancient coins, tokens and medals, and other topics from around the world.

Exhibitors have the option to enter their displays in competitive (judged), non-competitive, or marquee (invitational) categories. Competitive exhibits are judged on a variety of standards, including educational value, presentation, and degree of difficulty. In addition, exhibitors can chose to enter their display for the National Coin Week award, with the winner receiving a full scholarship to ANA Summer Seminar. To be eligible for the National Coin Week award, an exhibit's numismatic contents cannot exceed \$250.
