

## ANA LIBRARY HOLDS MAIL AUCTION TO RAISE FUNDS FOR PRESERVATION

Duplicate books and auction catalogs are being auctioned by the American Numismatic Association (ANA) Library to raise funds to improve member services in the world's largest, numismatic circulating library.

"With this first-ever mail-bid auction, we hope to generate the more funds for projects like book preservation, acquisition and restoration; archive development; and the Library Imagining Project available on the ANA's web site (www.money.org) and on CD-ROM," says Librarian Nawana Britenriker. "Every year, many ANA Summer Seminar attendees eagerly look forward to the Library's annual book and auction catalog sale. However, after each sale numerous items remain unsold. Because many Association members are unable to attend the summer sale, we decided to offer those items to the membership through this mail-bid sale."

Among the items offered are auction catalogs from Sotheby's, Stacks, and Bowers and Merena. A list of catalogs, books, periodicals and pamphlets is available from the Library by mail and is posted on the ANA's web site. Members of Friends of the Library/Libris in Socii (FOLLIS) can submit bids through February 29. From March 1 through the end of National Coin Week (April 16-22), the sale will be open to all ANA members.
