

EXHIBITORS RECOGNIZED IN FT. LAUDERDALE

Robert M. Hawes of South Daytona, Florida, received both the Best-in-Show Exhibit Award and the People's Choice Award for his display entitled "A Numismatic Trip Through History" at the American Numismatic Association's (ANA) National Money Show 2000 in Ft. Lauderdale, Florida, March 3-5.

In recognition of his efforts, Hawes received a 5-ounce, 14kt-gold medal produced and donated by The Franklin Mint for his Best-in-Show award and a certificate. For the People's Choice Award, Hawes received \$100.

The first runner-up award was presented to Mark Rabinowitz of Melbourne Beach, Florida, for his exhibit "Naval and Maritime Continental Currency Signers."

Radford Stearns of Lilburn, Georgia, received the second runner-up award for his exhibit "Researching the Sestroretsk." Rabinowitz and Stearns each received a certificate.

The first ANA presented its first National Coin Week Exhibit Award to Clayton O. Grant of Ft. Pierce, Florida, for his exhibit "Commemorative State Quarters, Year One in Ten." Grant received a plaque.

The awards were announced at a special ceremony on Saturday afternoon, March 4.
