The ANA Board will Meet in Atlanta

(Colorado Springs, Colorado) The Board of Governors of the American Numismatic Association will hold business meetings Wednesday and Thursday, April 5-6, at the Cobb Galleria Centre, room 106, in Atlanta, prior to the National Money Show™.

On the agenda during the open session Wednesday afternoon from 2 to 5 p.m. is approval of the 2006/07 budget, the Club Representative Program, a proposed new membership category for dealers, rewards and an overview and update to the organization's strategic plan.

On Thursday beginning at 9 a.m., the board will discuss outreach and education programs including partnerships with other organizations, and the annual Summer Seminar as well as dates for future conventions.

Presidential committees and task forces, including Bylaws and Governance, Convention and Exhibits will give their reports and propose ideas for discussion.

"With the exception of an executive session Wednesday morning, all meetings are open and the public is welcome to attend" said ANA Executive Director, Chris Cipoletti. "We will have materials available before the meetings begin that are pertinent to the agenda items, including motions and background information supplied to the board prior to the meeting."
