

## **A FEW OPENINGS STILL AVAILABLE FOR ANA NUMISMATIC THEATRE IN JACKSONVILLE**

The American Numismatic Association (ANA) still has a few openings for Numismatic Theatre presentations at the ANA's National Money Show, in Jacksonville, Florida, March 7-9, 2002.

"Numismatic Theatre is one of the best educational programs in the hobby," says ANA Education Director Gail Baker. "For many, many years, the ANA has been proud to host presentations on topics ranging from ancient to modern coinage, paper money, tokens and medals. ANA's Numismatic Theatre presentations will be videotaped by David Lisot of Media Resource Corporation. Speakers will be provided five free copies of the completed video.
