EDUCATIONAL PROGRAMS SCHEDULED FOR ANA SHOW IN CHARLOTTE

An expanded offering of educational programs, catering to all ages and interests, will be offered before and during the American Numismatic Association National Money Show™ March 16-18 at the Charlotte Convention Center in Charlotte, N.C.

The educational program will kick off March 14-15 with six, two-day seminars:

- Counterfeit Detection of United States Coins
- Fundamentals of Grading United States Coins
- Introduction to Confederate and Southern States Currency
- Civil War Numismatics
- Digital Photography
- Coins of the Roman Republic
