Each summer, collectors from around the world gather in Colorado Springs, Colorado, for two unforgettable sessions filled with hands-on classes, new friendships, and a shared passion for numismatics.

Scholarship applications must be postmarked no later than January 31, 2026. Recipients will attend one of two week-long sessions, **June 20-25** or **June 27-July 2**, held on the picturesque Colorado College campus adjacent to ANA headquarters. Scholarships are awarded based on need and merit and are open to both adults and young numismatists (YNs).

<u>Summer Seminar</u> isn't just about coins—it's about the connections. Students spend their days immersed in fascinating topics led by top numismatic instructors, then enjoy lively evening activities, auctions, and tours surrounded by others who share their passion.

YNs ages 13-17 can apply for the ANA Young
Numismatist Scholarship, the Martin D. Weiss Memorial YN Scholarship, the David Lisot
Memorial Scholarship, or the Greg Lyon Memorial Scholarship.

Adults 18 and older may qualify for the Robert Lecce Adult Scholarship. Additional scholarships include the Charles O. Browne Scholarship for students (ages 15-25) attending *Advanced U.S. Coin Grading and Problem Coins*, and the Everett Hull Scholarship for applicants ages 15 and older.



Full scholarships include tuition, room and board, and airfare. Partial scholarships cover tuition only.
